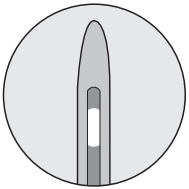

CHOOSING THE RIGHT NEEDLE

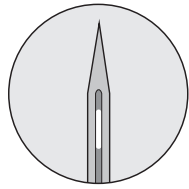
WHICH NEEDLE IS IDEAL FOR YOUR PROJECT

Use this guide to determine which home machine needle is right for your project



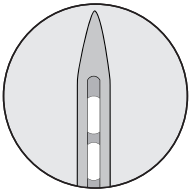
BALL POINT (BALL)

These needles are best for sewing knitted fabrics like jersey and fleece.



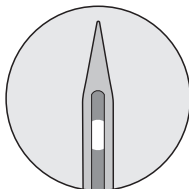
MICROTEX

These needles are perfect for fine or dense woven fabrics like silk, microfibers or coated materials.



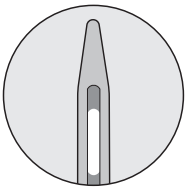
DOUBLE EYE

Universal needle with two eyes. Ideal for wovens and knits. Great for shading or texturing.



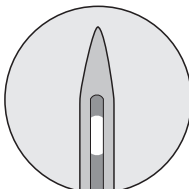
QUILTING

These needles are best for quilting applications or sewing multiple layers and can be used on buttonholes.



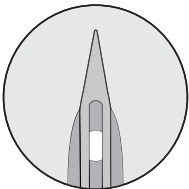
EMBROIDERY

These needles work best for embroidery applications when sewing with thicker threads.



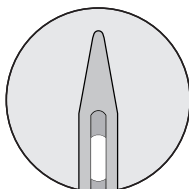
REGULAR/UNIVERSAL

These needles are ideal for all around sewing and work great on a variety of fabrics.



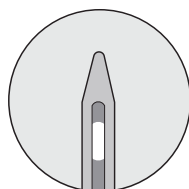
HEMSTITCH

These needles feature a wing on either side for light or medium weight wovens.



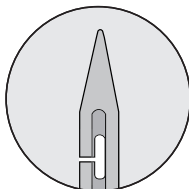
STRETCH

These needles are best for slinky knits, spandex, foundation garments, elastic, lycra and silk jersey. They have a special eye area on the needle.



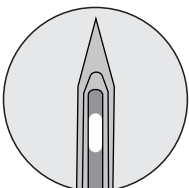
JEANS/DENIM

These needles are excellent for thicker fabrics like jeans, canvas and coated fabrics.



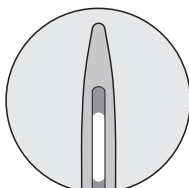
SELF-THREADING

These needles are best for wovens, some knits, linen, nylon, polyester, Tulle, velour, wool, organza and fleece.



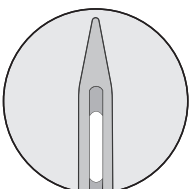
LEATHER

These needles are ideal for all kinds of leather and suede sewing. Cutting point is not suitable for textiles.



TOP STITCH

These needles work best when sewing thicker seams. Ideal for decorative stitching and buttonholes. Has a very long eye.



METALLIC

These needles have an elongated eye to prevent shredding and breaking of metallic threads.
