

# Blind Stitch Thread Size Chart

## Monofilament sizing can be confusing.

When determining what size nylon thread should be used for a certain project, it's best to use the thinnest thread allowable that will still provide a strong seam. The thinner the thread – the more flexible it will be. Plus, it lessens a puckered appearance.

#13	.005"	Overlock, Blind Stitching, Knit Goods, Hemming Draperies, Garments, Multi-Needle Quilting, Stuffed Toys
#18	.006"	Quilting, Blind Stitching, Heavier Garments, Stretch Garment Tacking, Stuffed Toys, Pillows
#25	.007"	Heavier Outerwear, Light Leather, Single-Needle Quilting, Pleating, Draperies, Stuffed Toys
#52	.010"	Binding/Serging Carpets, Furniture and Braided Rugs
